An Ordinance No. 204

-1998

TO REVISE the compensation schedule for the employment classifications of Recreation Leader and Recreation Program Director by repealing existing Sections 307-581 and 307-589 of Division 4 of Chapter 307 of the Cincinnati Municipal Code and ordaining in their place new Sections 307-581 and 307-589 in Division 4 of Chapter 307 of the Cincinnati Municipal Code.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cincinnati, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That existing Sections 307-581 and 307-589 of Division 4 of Chapter 307 of the Cincinnati Municipal Code are hereby repealed.

Section 2. That in place of the sections repealed in Section 1 hereof, new Sections 307-581 and 307-589 of Division 4 of Chapter 307 of the Cincinnati Municipal Code, with variable hourly wage rates as follows, are hereby ordained:

Sec. 307-581. Recreation Leader

Hourly Rates - \$5.15, \$5.25, \$5.50, \$6.00, \$6.50

Sec. 307-589. Recreation Program Director

Hourly Rates - \$7.00, \$7.50, \$8.00, \$8.50, \$9.00

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest time allowed by law.
